#### MINUTES OF THE TRAER CITY COUNCIL

The City Council of Traer, lowa met in regular session on Monday, April 4th 2022 at 7:00 p.m. at Municipal Hall.

#### ROLL CALL

Mayor Holden called the meeting to order at 7:00pm with Council Members Rausch, Erhardt, Holst and Panfil present. Kennedy was absent.

#### APPROVAL OF AGENDA

Mayor Holden informed the Council that he'd like to move the discussion on the Law Enforcement Contract up to the consent agenda portion of the meeting when Sheriff Kucera reads his report. MOTION by Rausch, seconded by Panfil, that the agenda is approved. Motion approved unanimously with a roll call vote.

#### **CONSENT AGENDA**

MOTION by Panfil, seconded by Holst, that the minutes of the March 7<sup>th</sup>, 2022 meeting are approved. Motion approved unanimously with a roll call vote.

MOTION by Panfil, seconded by Erhardt, that the March Checks (#29750-29813), totaling \$295,773.41, are approved. Motion approved unanimously with a roll call vote.

Sheriff Kucera arrived to the meeting approx. 7:30pm and gave his monthly report. During this time the council discussed the law enforcement contract with him. Some concerns the council had included how the deputies are reporting their hours and the wording of the proposed contract. Kucera explained the way deputy hours are reported and that they are including patrolling hours in their reports. Kucera told the council he would be re-word the contract and send back to the council for further review and possible action at May's meeting. No action was taken.

#### PROPOSAL OF SALE OF CERTAIN REAL PROPERTY

The Traer Development Corp. and the City of Traer have received an offer of \$52,000 from Steve & Julie Arndt for Lots 29 and 30 in the Prairie West, Phase 3 addition. MOTION by Panfil, seconded by Rausch, to approve 04-04-22-01 Purposing the Sale of Certain Real Property, with a public hearing taking place on Monday, May 2<sup>nd</sup> 2022 at 7:00pm. Motion approved unanimously with a roll call vote.

### 2022 STREET IMPORVEMENT PROJECT

The 2022 street improvement project is moving forward and with that, the council needs to set a bid date for when project bids would be due, a public hearing date to discuss the project plans, cost, specifications, etc. and an award date, for when the council could approve and award a contract for the project. Leland with Veenstra & Kimm sent a tentative schedule for the council to review, which set the bid date as April 28<sup>th</sup> 2022 and the public hearing and award date for May 2<sup>nd</sup> 2022. MOTION by Holst, seconded by Rausch, to approve the schedule of events as Veenstra & Kimm has suggested. Motion approved unanimously with a roll call vote.

### **TAYLOR PARK MOWING BIDS**

The council reviewed and discussed 3 mowing bids that were submitted in regards to the Taylor Park/Pool mowing job. The bids that were received were from Precision Lawn care in the amount of \$395/time, Ayden Staker in the amount of \$350/time and Trent Whitmore in the amount of \$320/time. The council discussed how well Precision has done for us these past few years and how well they've made the park look. It's a large project and Precision always has the equipment and manpower needed to get the job done. The council was happy to see 2 local young men put a bid in, and definitely like the idea of working with them in the future. The council would like to start this bidding process sooner next year to allow for conversations to be had with interested parties about equipment needed, etc. MOTION by Panfil, seconded by Holst to approve awarding the bid to Precision Lawn Care for the 2022 season, but to check back with the bidders next winter, to discuss more with them and explore changing things for 2023. Motion approved unanimously with a roll call vote.

# **CONCERNS/COMMENTS/OTHER BUSINESS**

As a follow-up to previous meetings, the council once again discussed nuisance properties. Abatement notices have been sent to 3 properties, located on Berlin Ave., since the last council meeting. The notices gave the occupants of the home until April 18<sup>th</sup> to clean up the property, if not cleaned the City can choose to go in and clean the property, passing all charges on to the homeowner. Properties were reviewed again on April 1st, with little to no changes being made. Properties will be reviewed again prior to April 18<sup>th</sup> to check for changes and before abatement procedures begin. Clerk Blaine informed the council that she had spoken with Cooley Sanitation about the situation, Cooley Sanitation has handled issues like this before and would be willing to assist the city with this project. Their only request is an enforcement authority of some sort be present. Clerk Blaine assured them that the Tama Co. Sheriff's Department would be present if action was taken. MOTION by Panfil, seconded by Erhardt, to approve moving forward with abatement procedures after April 18<sup>th</sup> 2022 using Cooley Sanitation and the Tama Co. Sheriff's Department. Motion approved unanimously with a roll call vote.

The council reviewed bids that were received to replace the double doors on the west wall of the Memorial Building. The double doors are in very bad shape and need replaced. The council requested at March's meeting that we seek bids for an overhead door option. 4 bids were received, 1 for the construction portion of the project (Monat Built for \$3,300) and 3 overhead door bids (Overhead Door \$2,428.68, Halstead Doors \$2,050.00 and Christie Door Company \$2,200). MOTION by Panfil, seconded by Erhardt, to approve the bids for Monat Built and Halstead Doors to install an overhead door to replace the current double doors. Motion approved unanimously with a roll call vote.

## **STAFF REPORTS**

Clerk Blaine briefly touched on a property that's located at 220 Berlin and currently on the market. With the recent sale of a Prairie West lot and the potential for 2 more in the next month, and having the extra revenue that we weren't expecting. Clerk Blaine is wondering if

the city shouldn't maybe take a look at purchasing that property. It is in the flood plain, and the options for a potential buyer are very limited. The council did agree, if the city can get it for the right price it wouldn't hurt to look into.

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned.
